Understanding the Spanish Speaking ELL: A Hybrid Course

April 20 from 5:00 – 7:00pm, in person

Continuing with Online Learning until May 11, 2020

Have you ever wondered why some of your Spanish speaking students do the things they do or say the things they say? In this course, compare how the English and Spanish languages are structured and how you can guide your Spanish speaking ELLs to use their native language as a tool (rather than a hindrance) to learning the English language. Each participant will receive a copy of *English Grammar for Students of Spanish; The Study Guide for those Learning Spanish*.

The introduction to this course will be in person. You will receive the book and instructions on how to complete the course online using the user-friendly platform, Schoology.
